Je'lial is official Warlord CCG fiction, written by Andrew Getting. Its original publication date is October 15, 2003. Je'lail accompanied the Overlord Attack From the Shadows.

It reads:

Before the Medusan Lords, there were the Ten. Ensconced in shadow and moving solely to protect their unfathomable interests, the Ten hovered at the periphery of the Accordlands. They bestowed great reward and harsh punishment in equal measure, and always in strictest anonymity. The Ten's cloak of secrecy was so complete that only the most furtive of minds considered the group to be born of more than mere superstition.
